Dear Parishioners.

We meet the prophet Elijah in our first reading this Sunday from the first Book of Kings. After an apparently successful career defending the Lord God, and opposing the rival cults of Baal with their priests and political influence, Elijah could take no more. He was worn out. He'd had enough. He didn't want to be God's prophet any longer. The journey ahead seemed too much for him. Elijah longed to die. He could see no future. Elijah found himself in a time of religious crisis.

But the Lord who had called Elijah to be a prophet came to his aid. The Lord provided for his needs and by means of a meal of bread and water, gave him enough sustenance to undertake an arduous desert trek to Horeb, the mountain of God. Horeb - an alternative name in some Old Testament passages for Sinai - is where Elijah hoped to renew his trust in God, and to recapture a sense of the beauty and strength of God's continual presence in his life.

The story of Elijah can inspire and encourage us today. Like them, we too can find ourselves worn out by the past, ground down by the present and unable to face the future. What do we do? Where do we go? To whom do we turn for help? Our help comes from the Lord. With confidence we cast our cares upon Jesus who is the bread come down for heaven, and who will sustain us in the journey of life.

Next Sunday is the Feast of the Assumption. This Feast will be celebrated solennly by Catholics throughout Aotearoa this year as the nation will be rededicated to the care of our Lady of Assumption. All are welcome to this celebration of solemnity.

8th August. 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B. (Psalter W.3)

There is no need for us to fear.

Today is the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Abraham, with complete faith in God's promise, took his family into the unknown, leaving behind so much that was familiar.

We too must not be held back by our possessions, but must move into the future, always ready to answer God's call.

Let us never forget that our faith enables us to share in the divine plan for our world. We are chosen by God to share his love with others.

FIRST READING: WISDOM 18:6-9

The same power that overcame the enemies of the Hebrews in Egypt also called God's people to himself.

SECOND READING: HEBREWS 11:1-2,8-19

Abraham and his wife Sarah placed their faith in God's promise to them. The writer speaks of the fruit it bore, and reminds us that such a faith brings God's blessings.

GOSPEL READING : *LUKE 12 : 32 - 48*

We must not let our possessions hold us back from doing God's will, and we must always be ready to give what he asks from us.

Imagine the scene: a man stands with his only son before his lord. The lord promises that all his lands will go to this man, from whose descendants will be born a great lasting dynasty. In the next breath the lord orders the man to send his son on a suicide mission. Where then is the inheritor?

Only when the man, in utter obedience to his lord, shows that he will obey, is an alternative solution offered. The son need not to die after all. It is a scenario which is familiar, for it is echoed in the story of Abraham and his son Isaac.

Abraham, having been promised land and descendants, is asked to sacrifice his only son, to go against all the natural instincts of a father. Only when, with complete faith in God's divine purpose, he agrees, is Isaac saved by God's intervention.

Let us put our faith in God in times of difficulty. May our loving lord will continue to bless you all and your families throughout this new week. Thanks for your continuous support to our parishes.
